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

Subject: Nominations for 2012 "New Faces of Engineering" Award Program – Suspense: 12 Oct 2011

Applicability: Information

1. The purpose of this ECB is to solicit your nomination of outstanding young engineers, civilian or military, working in the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) for recognition in cooperation with the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE) National Engineers Week Foundation's *New Faces of Engineering* program during the 2012 National Engineers Week. This program strives to promote accomplishments of young engineers by highlighting their engineering contributions and the resulting impacts on society.
2. Each USACE Major Subordinate Command (MSC) may provide up to three nominees. A HQUSACE panel will evaluate the submitted nominees and select five engineers who will be recognized as USACE's 2012 *New Faces of Engineering*, and will then become the USACE **nominees** for the NSPE Engineers Week Foundation's national program. An NSPE evaluation panel will select the top dozen nominated engineers from all participating agencies who will then be recognized in a full-page advertisement in *USA Today* during Engineers Week in February 2012. All five USACE selectees will be recognized by a variety of means.
3. Your nominees do not have to be registered professional engineers (P.E. or E.I.T.), but must have a degree in engineering from an ABET accredited U.S. college or university, or equivalent international educational institution, and be 30 years of age or younger as of 31 December 2011.
4. All nominations must be complete and typed on the official NSPE electronic nomination form and submitted electronically to the POC below by COB 12 October 2011. This deadline will not be extended so that equal opportunity is provided for all nominees.
